Red Bull Arena is the benchmark in the North American soccer stadium landscape and sets the standard for other venues of its kind across the continent. The 25,000-seat state-of-the-art facility located in Harrison, New Jersey is the home of the New York Red Bulls of Major League Soccer (MLS) and opened in March 2010, when the Red Bulls defeated Brazilian side, Santos FC, 3-1.

Since then, Red Bull Arena has hosted a number of top club and international squads including the U.S. Men's and Women's National Teams, Ecuador, Colombia, Czech Republic, Turkey, Manchester City (England) and Juventus (Italy). The arena is structured to create a distinct soccer atmosphere as fans in the front row are just 21 feet from the touchlines. Its dynamic roof is a curving structure that wraps the entire arena in

an elegant metal shell to create an architectural statement of power and elegance.

Red Bull Arena's roof extends 120 feet from the last seat to just over the field's touchlines, with 60 feet of the roof being translucent to let in natural light. The stadium also has a unique, one of a kind media seating section with over 100 seats located directly behind the player bench area in

the lower bowl. Media members have access to the media work room, photo room, and press conference room. The team locker rooms open to the media 15 minutes after the conclusion of every MLS match.









ALI CURTIS was named the Red Bulls Sporting Director on December 23, 2014, succeeding Andy Roxburgh.

Curtis is responsible for all soccer activities at the club, including player acquisition and scouting, oversight of the coaching staff, technical staff and youth development as well as management of the soccer operations budget and salary cap.

In his first season, Curtis put together a Red Bulls coaching staff and roster that won the 2015 Supporters' Shield with an 18-10-6 record and league-best +19 goal differential. The 18 regular seasons wins, along with 12 wins at home and 60 points earned, set new franchise records.

In one of his first moves as Sporting Director, Curtis orchestrated a complex deal with the Montreal Impact that saw New York acquire midfielder Felipe, who started all 34 regular season matches for New York, and the top spot in the MLS allocation rankings, which the club used to complete the transfer of U.S. international Sacha Kljestan the following day. Kljestan proved to be the driving force behind New York's attack, finishing the 2015 season with eight goals and 14 assists, tying a club record for most assists in an MLS season.

Before joining the Red Bulls, Curtis spent seven seasons working for Major League Soccer, as part of the Player Relations and Competition Department and as the Special Assistant to the Office of the Commissioner.

Most recently, Curtis was the Senior Director of Player Relations and Competition where his key responsibilities included overseeing MLS club budgets, negotiating over 200 player contracts per year, leading key areas of renegotiation of the current Collective Bargaining Agreement and leading the MLS Player Development Committee.

Curtis also supervised the MLS Homegrown Player Program, which has resulted in 20-40 signings per year and was responsible for the league-to-league strategic partnership that led to the MLS/USL PRO Club affiliations.

Along with his MLS experience, Curtis worked as an analyst for JP Morgan Chase Private Bank from 2004-2007 in Chicago and Los Angeles.

A former MLS player himself, Curtis was the second overall pick in the 2001 MLS SuperDraft by the Tampa Bay Mutiny. The forward spent four seasons in MLS with the Mutiny, D.C. United and FC Dallas (formerly the Dallas Burn). In four seasons, Curtis made 65 total appearances (35 starts) while scoring nine goals and adding eight assists.

Curtis is a graduate of Duke University where we was a standout college player and earned the 1999 Hermann and the 2000 MAC Award as the nation's best player. The awards have since been combined into the MAC Hermann award.



Marsch's side was also tough on the road, posting the second-most road wins in MLS with a 6-7-4 record, scoring the most road goals (27) and finishing as the only team in MLS with a positive road goal differential. Before joining the Red Bulls, Marsch was the

New York posted an 18-10-6 record, tied for best overall with FC Dallas, and a league-best +19 goal differential. The 18 wins set a new franchise record, as did 12 wins at home, and 60 points earned. Marsch's side led MLS in scoring in 2015 with 62 goals, and was only shut out twice during the regular season. The Red Bulls also allowed the fewest goals in the Eastern Conference.

JESSE MARSCH was named the 15th coach in

New York franchise history on January 7, 2015. In

his first season at the helm, Marsch was named

MLS Coach of the Year for leading the Red Bulls

to the 2015 Supporters' Shield, and the best

regular season in franchise history.

Marsch opened his tenure with a seven-game unbeaten streak, the longest in MLS that season. New York spent the entire season at or near the top of the Eastern Conference standings, and went 14-5-1 over the last 20 games on the run to the Supporters' Shield.

head coach of the Montreal Impact during the club's inaugural season in 2012. Marsch led the Impact to 12 wins in the club's first season, the most wins by an expansion club since 1998, when the Chicago Fire, with Marsch and current assistant Chris Armas in the midfield, took the league by storm, winning the 1998 MLS Cup and 1998 U.S. Open Cup.

Marsch also has experience coaching with US Men's National Team, serving as Bob Bradley's assistant for the 2010 FIFA World Cup and the 2011 Gold Cup. The USMNT advanced to the knockout round in the 2010 FIFA World Cup and to the tournament final in the 2011 Gold Cup.

The Racine, Wisconsin native enjoyed an impressive playing career as well, winning three MLS Cups and four US Open Cup Championships during 14 years in the league with D.C. United, Chicago Fire and Chivas USA. Marsch, an MLS original, made 321 appearances in 14 seasons, scoring 31 goals and 40 assists.

He remains among the all-time leaders in Chicago Fire history, sixth all-time in appearances (200), and starts (182), and minutes played (16,300). His 19 goals for the Fire are the ninth most in club history, and his 29 assists rank seventh amongst all Chicago players.

During his playing days, Marsch played for four Coaches of the Year in Bruce Arena (1997 D.C. United), Bob Bradley (1998 Chicago Fire), Dave Sarachan (2003 Chicago Fire) and Preki (2007 Chivas USA).

Along with a successful career in MLS, Marsch earned two Caps with the U.S. Men's National Team. In college, Marsch was a two-year captain at Princeton University, a two-time first team All-Ivy member and a first team All-American in 1995. Marsch most recently served as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, helping the Tigers to a 2014 Ivy League Championship.



DENIS HAMLETT, a former MLS player and coach, was named First Assistant by Jesse Marsch at the start of the 2015 MLS preseason.

Hamlett was born in Puerto Limon, Costa Rica, and grew up in Maryland. He played college soccer at George Mason University before joining the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the American Soccer League in 1992.

Hamlett played in both the American Soccer League, the NPSL and Continental Indoor Soccer League before being selected in the second round of the inaugural MLS draft in 1996 by the Colorado Rapids. The defender appeared in 31 games for Colorado before retiring at the end of the 1996 season.

Hamlett transitioned to coaching in 1997, earning his coaching license from U.S. Soccer and joining the Chicago Fire staff as an assistant prior to the 1998 season, the same year Marsch joined the Fire from D.C. United. He was named first assistant in Chicago in 2001, and served as interim head coach briefly in 2007, and was named head man for the 2008 season.

Under Hamlett, the Fire reached two straight MLS Eastern Conference Finals, as well as the 2009 SuperLiga Final.

Hamlett has also done coaching stints with the Vancouver Whitecaps, and was part of Marsch's staff in Montreal in 2012.



CHRIS ARMAS joined the New York Red Bulls coaching staff ahead of the 2015 season, reuniting with former teammate Jesse Marsch and coach Denis Hamlett.

Armas, a Brooklyn native, was drafted by the Los Angeles Galaxy in the inaugural MLS draft in 1996 after two professional seasons with the Long Island Rough Riders of the USISL.

After two seasons with the Galaxy, Armas was traded to the Chicago Fire ahead of their inaugural 1998 campaign, the same offseason the club acquired Marsch. Armas played a large role in the Fire's storied run to the 1998 MLS Cup and U.S. Open Cup double in their first season. Armas was named to the MLS Best XI

for four straight seasons from 1998 through 2001 before seeing his streak broken by an ACL injury that caused him to miss much of the 2002 campaign. He bounced back in 2003, being named MLS Comeback Player of the Year and MLS Best XI for the fifth time.

Armas is one of just four players to earn Best XI distinction five times, second only to Landon Donovan's seven Best XI selections.

Armas played in 264 MLS regular season games, 260 of which were starts, recording 12 goals and 48 assists. Appearing in 37 playoff games, Armas found a bulk of his success with Marsch at the Fire, winning four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles and an MLS Supporter's Shield

in addition to the 1998 MLS Cup. Captaining the side from 2003-2007, he was named an MLS All-Star six times and was voted team MVP in 2003.

He was also named U.S. Soccer's Male Athlete of the Year in 2000. After the Fire's double-winning campaign in 1998 Armas became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, cracking the lineup just after the 1998 World Cup. He was part of the FIFA Gold Cup squads in 2002 and 2005, and was initially named to the 23-man roster for the 2002 World Cup in Japan before suffering an injury in a friendly leading up to the tournament. In all, Armas earned 66 caps for the United States.

Armas retired at the end of the 2007 season after 12 years in MLS. He served the following season as an assistant coach for the Fire under current Red Bulls assistant Denis Hamlett. Since then, he has returned to the New York area with his family, most recently serving as head coach of the women's varsity team at Adelphi University on Long Island. Armas led the program to back-to-back conference title game appearances in the NE-10, and reached the ECAC Championship in 2014.



PRESTON BURPO joined the New York Red Bulls staff ahead of the 2016 MLS season. Burpo, a former MLS goalkeeper, previously coached on Jesse Marsch's staff with the Montreal Impact in 2012, and with D.C. United for the 2013 and 2014 seasons.

A native of Bethesda, Md., Burpo started his playing career with USISL teams in 1995 and had a stint with Jamaican club Harbour View FC before signing with Seattle Sounders FC, then in the United Soccer League, in 1997. Burpo played nine seasons with Seattle before moving to MLS side Chivas USA in 2006, where he was a teammate of both Marsch and current Red Bulls midfielder Sacha Kljestan.

In all, Burpo made 59 career appearances in MLS, 22 with Chivas USA before stretches with the Colorado Rapids and New England Revolution.

After spending one season as a scout with the U.S. Soccer Federation, Burpo joined Marsch's staff ahead of the Montreal Impact's inaugural season in 2012. He subsequently spent two seasons as the goalkeeper coach

with D.C., overseeing Bill Hamid's MLS Goalkeeper of the Year season in 2014.

Prior to his professional career, Burpo graduated from Southern New Hampshire University, where he played from 1991 - 1994, and remains eighth on the school's career shutout leaders list, with 17.

1994

JUNE 15 New York/New Jersey is named to be an MI S team location

JUNE 16 JULY 10 Giants Stadium plays host to seven sold-out World Cup games. In all, 525,000 fans watch the world's greatest sports spectacle at Giants Stadium.

NOVEMBER 1 Charlie Stillitano, the NY/NJ Venue Executive Director during the World Cup, is named Vice President and General Manager of the MLS team, then known as the Empire Soccer Club.

1995

JUNE 6 The original 10 teams are in place. Metromedia's John Kluge and Stuart Subotnick, are announced as the investor-operators of the team that will play in Giants Stadium.

AUGUST 4-6 The Empire Soccer Club shows commitment to local soccer fans by holding the Parmalat Cup. The event draws 80,000 spectators over two days. Benfica, Parma, Boca Juniors and the U.S. National Team put on a grand show at Giants Stadium.

OCTOBER 17 The Palladium nightclub in New York is host to "MLS Unveiled." Amid bright lights and high-decibel music, a world-class soccer league is born, complete with bold, colorful uniforms and some brash team nicknames. It is announced that the NY/NJ team will be known as the MetroStars and its first player will be local hero Tab Ramos, who dons a MetroStars uniform in public for the first time.

1996

JANUARY 3 On a snowy day at Giants Stadium, former Cosmos field boss Eddie Firmani is introduced as the first head coach of the MetroStars. The former Cosmos coach shares the spotlight with another familiar face, that of U.S. goalkeeper and World Cup Team captain Tony Meola, who joins Tab Ramos on the MetroStars' roster.

FEBRUARY 4 The Empire Radisson hotel in midtown Manhattan is the site of the MetroStars' biggest announcement to date. Italian international and A.C. Milan midfielder Roberto Donadoni joins the MetroStars. The twelve-year Serie Aveteran is presented with the No. 7 shirt by Stillitano.

FEBRUARY 5 Major League Soccer holds its first player draft, where the MetroStars select Philadelphia-born defender Matt Knowles with the ninth pick. By the end of the day, there are 16 new MetroStars.

FEBRUARY 26 The MetroStars are involved in the first player trade in league history, dealingdefender Troy Dayak to the San Jose Clash in exchange for defender Rhett Harty and a draft pick.

MARCH 4 The MetroStars go wheeling and dealing in Ft. Lauderdale at the league's first supplemental and college drafts. On a day when teams are looking for six players, the MetroStars come away with 10, including 11-year veteran of Serie A Nicola Caricola, a defender whom they select with the first supplemental pick. In the college draft, the MetroStars pick up Miles Joseph, a midfielder from Clifton Park, N.Y., and Clemson University.

MARCH 5 The MetroStars hold their first-ever practice session at the Giants Stadium bubble.

MARCH 13 Spring Training begins in Boca Raton, Florida, as some 20 players go fighting for jobs.

APRIL 13 History is made, as the MetroStars and the Los Angeles Galaxy meet at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California, playing before 69,250 fans. The MetroStars lose, 2-1, but a star is born in the 77th minute when Venezuelan Giovanni Savarese scores the first goal in team history.

APRIL 20 The MetroStars kick off in Giants Stadium before 46,826 fans, who witness a thrilling, if somewhat bizarre, game that ends in defeat in the 90th minute on an own goal by Nicola Caricola. It is the lone score in a 1-0 loss to the New England Revolution.

MAY 4 The MetroStars come from three goals down in a four-minute stretch to defeat the Tampa Bay Mutiny, 4-3, in a shootout for the first win in team history. Savarese ties the game with a bicycle kick in the 75th minute. Ramos nets the decisive shootout goal to the delight of the crowd.

MAY 16 Giovanni Savarese scores the first hat-trick in team history, scoring all three goals in a 3-0 win over the Colorado Rapids. It is the first regulation win in team history.

MAY 24 Head Coach Eddie Firmani resigns his position on the same day that the MetroStars play host to their first international opponent, Fiorentina of Italy. Argentine Gabriel Batistuta scores two goals and the Serie A giants go on to win, 4-0.

MAY 30 Portuguese coaching legend Carlos Queiroz becomes the second head coach of the MetroStars, but drops a 2-1 decision to D.C. United in his first game at the helm.

AUGUST 12 MetroStars sign Colombian striker Antony "El Pitufo" De Avila.

SEPTEMBER 15 Head Coach Carlos Queiroz announces he will leave at the end of the '96 season to become Head Coach of Grampus Eight of the J-League in Japan.

SEPTEMBER 24 Peter Vermes scored in the 11th round of the shootout as the MetroStars defeat D.C. United in the opening game of the playoffs, 3-2.

OCTOBER 2 MetroStars are eliminated in the playoffs in the decisive Game 3, as Rob Johnson's foul leads to an 88th-minute penalty kick by D.C.

OCTOBER 19 Roberto Donadoni is the first MetroStar to be named to the MLS Best XI

DECEMBER 30 The MetroStars announce the hiring of reigning World Cup champion coach Carlos Alberto Parreira of Brazil as head coach.

1997

FEBRUARY 2-3 The MetroStars acquire six new players at the supplemental and college drafts in Florida, including midfielder Brian Kelly of Duke University.

MARCH 6 The MetroStars announce plans for a new, state-of-the-art, modular grass field for Giants Stadium.

MAY 9 The San Jose Clash defeat the MetroStars, 1-0, in the first game played on the new modular grass field.

MAY 14 The MetroStars play host to their first national team, as they welcome Colombia to Giants Stadium. Colombia wins 2-0.

JULY 30 MetroStars sign World Cup winner Brazilian sweeper Branco.

SEPTEMBER 9 Midfield ace Roberto Donadoni accepts an offer to return to A.C. Milan.

SEPTEMBER 25 MetroStars lose to the Columbus Crew, 1-0, to miss the playoffs.

NOVEMBER 6 The MetroStars lose three players goalkeeper Zach Thornton, midfielder Manny Lagos, and defender Andrew Lewis - to the Chicago Fire in the first MLS expansion draft.

DECEMBER 11 Carlos Alberto Parreira agrees to accept the head coaching position for Saudi Arabia as they prepare their World Cup '98 campaign.

1998

JANUARY 14 Alfonso Mondelo, formerly the head coach of the Long Island Rough Riders, is introduced as the fourth head coach in MetroStars history.

FEBRUARY 1 The MetroStars make defender Mike Petke their top selection (eighth overall) of the MLS College Draft.

FEBRUARY 2 The MetroStars are assigned 18-year-old goalkeeper Tim Howard as a Project-40 player.

FEBRUARY 4 The MetroStars acquire U.S. National Team defender Alexi Lalas from the New England Revolution in the first three-team trade in MLS history.

MARCH 5 While in Italy for preseason training, the MetroStars drop a 3-1 decision to Roberto Donadoni and A.C. Milan. Jim Rooney scores the lone Metro goal.

JUNE 15 Tab Ramos becomes the first MetroStar to play in the World Cup, in the USA's 2-0 loss to Germany. He will soon be joined by Chilean Marcelo Vega.

SEPTEMBER 21 Following a six-game losing streak, Alfonso Mondelo is relieved of his coaching duties and is replaced by former U.S. and Mexico coach Bora Milutinovic.

OCTOBER 3 MetroStars drop the second game of the playoffs to the Columbus Crew, 2-1 in the shootout, to end the season.

JANUARY 20 Forward Giovanni Savarese, along with a second-round selection in the 2000 MLS College Draft, is traded to the New England Revolution in a three-team trade that brings forward Raul Diaz Arce to the MetroStars. Diaz Arce and Chilean international midfielder Marcelo Vega are then traded to the San Jose Clash for an allocated player to be named and future considerations. Savarese departs the MetroStars as the team record-holder with 41 goals in league play, 44 in all competitions.

In exchange for Sonora, the MetroStars receive United's second and third-round selections in the 2000 MLS College Draft and San Jose's third-round pick in the 2000 MLS College Draft.

AUGUST 17 MLS signs German superstar Lothar Matthäus and allocates him to the MetroStars for the 2000 MLS Season.

OCTOBER 29 The MetroStars and head coach Bora Milutinovic mutually agree to part ways. MetroStars assistant coach Fernando Clavijo named interim head coach.

NOVEMBER 9 Lothar Matthäus is presented to the local media at the ESPNZone in New York City.

NOVEMBER 29 MetroStars name Octavio Zambrano head coach.

JANUARY 12 1999 MLS Executive of the Year Nick Sakiewicz, formerly of the Tampa Bay Mutiny, is appointed General Manager of the MetroStars.

JANUARY 28 MetroStars acquire U.S. national team veteran Thomas Dooley from the Columbus Crew in exchange for defender Mike Duhaney.

FEBRUARY 6 MetroStars select UCLA defender Steve Shak with the first overall pick in the 2000 MLS SuperDraft.

MARCH 3 MLS allocates Colombian International forward Adolfo "El Tren" Valencia to the MetroStars.

APRIL 1 Lothar Matthäus. Adolfo Valencia, and Alex Comas make their home debuts at Giants Stadium, leading the MetroStars to a 3-2 home win over defending MLS Cup champions D.C. United before a crowd of 27.322.

APRIL 19 Defensive midfielder Daniel Hernandez is acquired from the Tampa Bay Mutiny in exchange for the rights to Daniel Alvarez (2000 fourth-round pick). Defender Steve Jolley is acquired from the Los Angeles Galaxy in exchange for a MetroStars second-round pick in 2001.

APRIL 22 Mike Petke scores a 94th-minute goal in overtime to defeat D.C. United. 3-2. at RFK Stadium. The MetroStars win in their first overtime appearance.

MAY 13 The final piece of the puzzle for a successful 2000 season is acquired after the MetroStars draft striker Clint Mathis with the first selection in the MLS dispersal draft. Mathis went on to collect 39 points (13 goals, 13 assists) in 21 games with the MetroStars.

OCTOBER 13 Nick Sakiewicz wins the MLS Executive of the Year award for the second consecutive year just 10 months after being appointed general manager. He won the award the previous season with the Tampa Bay Mutiny.

OCTOBER 14 Clint Mathis is named to the MLS Best XL He is also a finalist for the MLS MVP Award.

FEBRUARY 4 The team selects unknown forward Rodrigo Faria from the reserve team MetroStars Black with the #13 pick overall in the 2001 SuperDraft.

MARCH 28 Clint Mathis scores on a free kick in the 87th minute to give the U.S. a dramatic 2-1 road win at Honduras in World Cup qualifying.

MAY 5 The MetroStars score three goals in the game's last 11 minutes to come back and defeat D.C. United. 3-2. at Giants Stadium.

MAY 26 The MetroStars defeat UEFA Champions League winners Bayern Munich. 2-0 in a friendly at Giants Stadium.

JUNE 5 Clint Mathis suffers a torn ACL during a U.S. National Team practice in Columbus. OH. He misses the remainder of the season

JUNE 16 Mike Petke breaks the team record for minutes played (Tony Meola 8,100) after recording 100 minutes in a scoreless home draw against the San Jose Clash. Petke, who set the record in the 73rd minute, finishes the game with 8.126 career minutes.

SEPTEMBER 29 The MetroStars lose Game 3 of the MLS Cup semifinals and then the overtime minigame, 4-2 on aggregate, to be eliminated from the playoffs by the Los Angeles Galaxy.

OCTOBER 15 Fans in online voting on the league's official website (MLSNET.COM) name Clint Mathis as the recipient of the 2001 Goal of the Year with his April 28, 60-yard run against the Dallas Burn at Giants Stadium. Tim Howard is selected as the 2001 New York Life MLS Humanitarian of the Year.

OCTOBER 16 Tim Howard, in his first year as a starter, is selected as the 2001 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year.

OCTOBER 17 The Copa Merconorte game between the MetroStars and Mexican club Chivas of Guadalajara at Giants Stadium is canceled, after Chivas players and coaches inform the MetroStars they would not travel to the New York area to play. MetroStars win by a 2-0 forfeit.

OCTOBER 17 Rodrigo Faria is selected as the 2001 Rookie of the Year.

OCTOBER 28 The MetroStars, D.C. United, New York Power, and Washington Freedom host first of two benefit doubleheaders dubbed "The Unity Games" to aid victims of the September 11 attacks on New York City and Washington, D.C. The two doubleheaders (the second one was held November 3 at RFK Stadium in Washington) raised over \$250,000.

NOVEMBER 12 Tim Howard is named to the Board of Directors of the Tourette Syndrome Association of New Jersey (TSANJ).

NOVEMBER 21 Anschutz Entertainment Group (AEG) acquires the MetroStars from Metromedia Company.

5005

MARCH 27 Clint Mathis scores two goals for the U.S. in a 4-2 international friendly loss to Germany.

MAY 24 The largest trade (six players) in league history takes place when the MetroStars acquire forward Mamadou Diallo, midfielder Andy Williams and defender Ted Chronopoulos from the New England Revolution in exchange for forward Diego Serna and midfielders/defenders Daniel Hernandez and Brian Kamler.

JUNE 11 Clint Mathis scores the lone goal against South Korea to forge a crucial 1-1 tie during a Group D first-round match of the 2002 World Cup.

JUNE 15 The MetroStars defeat the Los Angeles Galaxy, 5-0, behind four goals from Mamadou Diallo for the biggest victory margin in team history.

SEPTEMBER 12 Tab Ramos plays what turns out to be his final career match at Giants Stadium in a 1-0 loss to D.C. United.

SEPTEMBER 21 MetroStars lose to New England, 3-0, and are denied a playoff berth a day later when the Chicago Fire beat the Columbus Crew.

OCTOBER 8 The MetroStars announce that Octavio Zambrano has been relieved of his head coaching duties.

OCTOBER 14 MetroStars defender Steve Jollev is named the 2002 United States Soccer Foundation MLS Humanitarian of the Year.

OCTOBER 19 MetroStars GK Tim Howard is voted to the MLS 2002 Pepsi Best XI, marking the second straight year he has received the honor. Tab Ramos is also named the recipient of the 2002 Commissioner's Award.

OCTOBER 21 Bob Bradley leaves the Chicago Fire to become the seventh head coach in MetroStars history. In return for the right to sign Bradley from the Fire, the MetroStars send forward Rodrigo Faria and a conditional 2004 MLS SuperDraft pick (the MetroStars choice of at least the 12th overall pick or a higher pick) to Chicago as compensation.

DECEMBER 16 Scottish legend Mo Johnston, a veteran of 15 years of top-level European club soccer as well as a driving force in leading the Kansas City Wizards to the 2000 MLS Cup championship, is named as an assistant coach by Bob Bradley.

DECEMBER 23 In a blockbuster trade with D.C. United, the team acquires defender Eddie Pope, forward Jaime Moreno, and midfielder Richie Williams from D.C. United in exchange for defender Mike Petke, the fifth pick overall in the 2003 SuperDraft, and an allocation.

5003

JANUARY 18 The team drafts seven new players during the 2003 SuperDraft in Kansas City to immediately inject a fusion of young talent onto the 2003 preseason roster.

APRIL 11 - The MetroStars acquire Honduran National Team midfielder Amado Guevara as an allocation and sign him to a multi-vear contract.

JUNE 14 New Jersey native and MetroStars midfielder/forward Eddie Gaven (16 years. 232 days) becomes the voungest player in club history and the second voungest player in league history to appear in an MLS regular season game. when he started in a 3-2 loss to the Chicago Fire at Giants Stadium.

Howard ends his Metro career with a record of 37-36-11, a 1.46 goals against average, and 15 shutouts in 85 games. The MetroStars acquire goalkeeper Jonny Walker to replace Howard. The Chilean First Division standout joins the Metros after a successful career with Universidad Catolica. Colo Colo, and Huachipato.

SEPTEMBER 20 In overtime, John Wolyniec scores off a 50-yard pass by Amado Guevara as the MetroStars defeat Columbus 1-0. The goal will be named runner-up for MLS Goal of the Year.

OCTOBER 1 The MetroStars reach their first Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final with late-game heroics, defeating rival D.C. United at Rutgers University, 3-2. John Wolyniec plays the hero as he deflects a Ricardo Clark shot in the 88th minute. which sends the MetroStars to the final against the Chicago Fire at Giants Stadium on October 15. Amado Guevara contributes two goals to help push the Metros to its first final in team history.

OCTOBER 15 In a physical battle between two familiar rivals, a second half goal by rookie forward Damani Ralph is all the Chicago Fire would need to earn a 1-0 victory over the MetroStars and the championship of the 2003 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup at Giants Stadium. The final is the first the Metros have qualified for in team history.

NOVEMBER 9 The MetroStars are eliminated from the playoffs by the New England Revolution. after losing 2-0 and tying 1-1.

NOVEMBER 22 At the 2003 MLS Gala Awards Ceremony at the Kodak Theater in Hollywood, California, MetroStars captain Eddie Pope is named to the 2003 MLS Best XI.

2004

JANUARY 16 The MetroStars select six players in the 2004 MLS Super Draft at the Charlotte Convention Center in Charlotte, NC: Seth Stammler, Zach Wells, Olivier Occean, Michael Bradley, Johnny David, and Jeff Parke.

JANUARY 22 MetroStars forward Clint Mathis signs a contract with German Bundesliga club Hanover 96 after spending the previous four seasons with the "Red and Black." Mathis ends his Metro career playing in 67 games (66 starts), scoring 33 goals and 21 assists for 87 points for second in scoring in team history.

MARCH 5 The Metros capture the 2004 La Manga Cup with a 1-0 victory over Viking FK of Stavanger, Norway at La Manga Club Resort in La Manga, Murcia, Spain, Rookie defender Jeff Parke scored the game-winner in the 27th minute to earn the Metros the preseason trophy. Veteran midfielder Amado Guevara earned Most Valuable Player honors after leading the Metros to the title and a 3-1-0 record in the tournament. To start the tournament, the MetroStars dropped a 1-0 result to Viking on February 25, 2004 in Group A. The "Red and Black" thumped FK Bodø/Glimt, 3-1, courtesv of two goals by Joselito Vaca, to advance to the semifinals. In the semis, the Metros defeated Ukrainian powerhouse Dynamo Kyiv, 3-2, to advance to the final.

MARCH 26 The MetroStars acquire Argentine forward Sergio Galvan Rey with an allocation from Colombian club Once Caldas.

JULY 31 MetroStars Eddie Gaven, Amado Guevara and Eddie Pope were starters for the Sierra Mist MLS All-Star Game at Washington D.C.'s RFK Stadium. While Pope is an All-Star veteran, being named in eight consecutive midseason classics, Gaven is the youngest player in history to be voted in as an All-Star starter and becomes the second youngest player to appear in the history of the event. In addition, Guevara captures the game's MVP with two goals and one assist.

SEPTEMBER 14 MetroStars forward Amado Guevara, along with other Hispanic MLS players, was honored by President George W. Bush at the White House in celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month.

OCTOBER 30 MetroStars eliminated from 2004 MLS Cup Playoffs by D.C. United on aggregate, 0-4.

NOVEMBER 11 MetroStars midfielder Amado Guevara named 2004 MLS MVP.

NOVEMBER 12 MetroStars defender Eddie Pope named 2004 Fair Play Award winner. Midfielders Eddie Gaven, Amado Guevara and defender Eddie Pope named to the 2004 MLS Best XI.

NOVEMBER 19 MetroStars midfielder
Pablo Brenes and defender Craig Ziadie
selected in the 2004 MLS Expansion Draft,
by Real Salt Lake and Chivas USA, respectively.

DECEMBER 10 MetroStars acquire defender Jeff Agoos from San Jose in exchange for a fourth-round pick in the 2005 MLS SuperDraft.

2005

JANUARY 14 MetroStars have a busy 2005 MLS SuperDraft Day. They execute three trades, first sending Cornell Glen to FC Dallas in exchange for the 12th overall selection in the 2005 draft, then sending midfielder Ricardo Clark to the San Jose Earthquakes in exchange for a portion of an allocation, and finally sending their natural second-round pick in the 2006 MLS SuperDraft to Real Salt Lake for a Youth International Slot. The Metros then select defender Tim Ward with the 12th overall selection and Chris Corcoran with the 25th overall pick.

FEBRUARY 1 MetroStars trade veteran defender Eddie Pope to Real Salt Lake in exchange for future considerations.

FEBRUARY 18 MetroStars acquire World Cup Champion and French International Youri Djorkaeff via allocation.

JUNE 7 MetroStars acquire forward Ante Razov from the Columbus Crew in exchange for forward John Wolyniec and a portion of an allocation.

JUNE 13 AEG announces that they have promoted Nick Sakiewicz to President of AEG NY Metro, and have named Alexi Lalas President and General Manager of the MetroStars.

JUNE 30 MetroStars claim four-time World Cup goalkeeper and Kearny, NJ native and former MetroStar Tony Meola off waivers.

AUGUST 4 AEG and the MetroStars announce that an agreement has been reached between the MetroStars, AEG, the Town of Harrison, Hudson County and the State of New Jersey to bring a new 20,000-seat stadium and entertainment complex to Harrison, NJ., to serve as the home of Major League Soccer's MetroStars. The new soccer stadium is the highest-profile project within the redevelopment of the historic Harrison waterfront, one of the largest urban redevelopment projects in recent state history.

OCTOBER 4 MetroStars announce that Bob Bradley has been relieved of his Head Coaching responsibilities and that Mo Johnston has been named interim head coach.

OCTOBER 16 MetroStars clinch a playoff berth for the third consecutive year with a 2-0 win over Chivas USA.

OCTOBER 19 The MetroStars name Mo Johnston head coach.

OCTOBER 29 The MetroStars lose to the New England Revolution, 3-1, to drop the playoff series 3-2 on aggregate.

NOVEMBER 11 Tony Meola, who spent four seasons with the MetroStars (1996-98, 2005), and Jeff Agoos, who spent one (2005), are named to the MLS All-Time Best XI.

JANUARY 20 New York trades the No. 5 pick in the 2006 MLS SuperDraft, along with defender Jason Hernandez, to Chivas USA for the rights to the No.1 overall selection in the 2006 MLS SuperDraft. Subsequently, New York drafts UCLA defender Marvell Wynne with the first overall pick. New York also acquires forward Jozy Altidore (17th overall) and midfielder Blake Camp (41st overall) in later rounds.

MARCH 9 Red Bull Company GmbH, producer of Red Bull Energy Drink, finalized an agreement with Major League Soccer to purchase the MetroStars from AEG and rename the team the "New York Red Bulls."

APRIL 2 In the inaugural match as the New York Red Bulls, the Red Bulls tie D.C. United 2-2 at RFK stadium in Washington D.C. Youri Djorkaeff scored the first goal in RedBulls history on a brilliant free kick from 30 yards out.

APRIL 8 Over 35,000 fans come to Giants Stadium to see the first home outing for the Red Bulls against the New England Revolution. With Shakira and Wyclef Jean performing at halftime, the game resulted in a scoreless tie.

APRIL 20 Marc de Grandpre is named Managing Director of Red Bull New York. In this role, de Grandpre will oversee all business and commercial aspects of the organization. He had been with Red Bull North America for more than seven years as the Director of Field Marketing where he oversaw all marketing activities for the company's East region.

MAY 20 New York Red Bulls forward Jean Philippe Peguero scores a hat trick in a 5-4 win over Chivas USA.

MAY 27 The Red Bulls defeat Bayern Munich, reigning champions of the German Bundesliga, 4-2. in an international friendly.

JUNE 27 Mo Johnston is relieved of his head coaching duties. Assistant coach Richie Williams was named interim coach and would serve in that position for six weeks. The Red Bulls also acquire defender Todd Dunivant from the Los Angeles Galaxy for a partial allocation.

JUIY 18 Red Bull New York hires former U.S. Men's National Team Manager Bruce Arena. Arena, the most successful coach in U.S. Men's Soccer history, will serve as the team's Sporting Director and Head Coach. Before his eight-year tenure with the national team, Arena was the head coach for D.C. United, leading them to the MLS Cup in 1996 and 1997, and head coach at the University of Virginia, where he led the Cavaliers to five national titles.

JULY 31 Former U.S. Men's National Team midfielder John Harkes is named assistant coach. Harkes played under Arena at the University of Virginia from 1985-87 and was a part of both Arena-coached MLS Cup Championship teams.

AUGUST 10 Red Bull New York acquires the rights to midfielder Dema Kovalenko and midfielder Shawn Kuykendall from D.C. United for a partial allocation.

AUGUST 12 Head coach Bruce Arena makes his debut with the Red Bulls against two-time reigning FIFA World Player of the Year Ronaldinho and his club FC Barcelona, champions of the Spanish La Liga, in a 4-1 loss. The game marked the largest crowd for both a New York and MLS game at Giants Stadium (79.002).

AUGUST 17 Forward John Wolyniec joins Red Bull New York from the Los Angeles Galaxy, for his fourth stint with the organization in exchange for a fourth-round draft pick in 2007 and a second-round draft pick in 2008. Wolyniec contributes quickly, scoring a goal in each of his first three starts as a Red Bull in 2006.

AUGUST 26 Led by Edson Buddle's hat trick, the Red Bulls defeat Real Salt Lake, 6-0, racking up numerous team and MLS records. All six goals were scored in the second half, tying the MLS record for goals in a half. New York scored the fastest six goals in MLS history (32 minutes). The game also marked the first win for Arena as the team's head coach and Sporting Director.

SEPTEMBER 16 A stunning 30-yard strike in the 83rd minute by 16-year-old rookie **Jozy Altidore** helps give the Red Bulls a 1-0 win over the Columbus Crew at Giants Stadium. Altidore becomes the fourth-youngest player to find the back of the net in MLS history.

SEPTEMBER 19 Red Bull New York and AEG break ground on its new stadium, Red Bull Park, in Harrison, NJ. Several politicians and dignitaries in attendance celebrate the 25,000-seat soccerspecific venue which is deemed to open in 2008.

OCTOBER 14 Needing a win and only a win to clinch the fourth and final playoff spot in the Eastern Conference, an Amado Guevara hat trick helps the Red Bulls defeat the Kansas City Wizards, 3-2, at Giants Stadium in front of 19,780, punching New York's ticket into the postseason. For Guevara, New York's captain, it is his third career hat trick.

OCTOBER 29 Despite a goal by Jozy Altidore, who becomes the youngest player in league history to score in the playoffs, the Red Bulls fall in a close, 2-1 decision to D.C. United in their Eastern Conference Semifinal Series.

NOVEMBER 27 Red Bull New York announces that it traded midfielder Amado Guevara to Chivas USA in exchange for a second designated player slot and a third-round draft pick in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft. The Red Bulls become the first team to have two designated player slots.

NOVEMBER 30 Red Bulls Jozy Altidore, Jerrod Laventure and Seth Stammler travel down to the Caribbean nation of Haiti in partnership with hip hop musician Wyclef Jean's movement, Yéle Haiti, for a six-day service trip. The players donated a substantial amount of equipment and apparel, conducted a number of soccer clinics and visited several other Yéle Haiti initiatives.

JANUARY 12 Red Bull New York drafts midfielders Dane Richards and Sinisa Ubiparipovic in the SuperDraft.

JANUARY 24 Red Bull New York signs one of the greatest players in American history in Claudio Reyna. Reyna becomes the Red Bulls' first Designated Player and was introduced in a press conference at Giants Stadium.

JANUARY 29 Red Bull New York signs veteran goalkeeper and former Dutch international Ronald Waterreus.

FEBRUARY 1 Red Bull New York announces that the team will train at Montclair State University for the entire 2007 MLS season in newly renovated facilities.

MARCH 23 Red Bull New York announces the acquisition of defender Hunter Freeman from the Colorado Rapids in exchange for a 2008 third-round SuperDraft pick and a 2009 fourth-round supplemental draft pick.

MARCH 30 Red Bull New York announces that it has reacquired veteran Clint Mathis from the Colorado Rapids for a fourth-round pick in the 2008 MLS SuperDraft and a conditional pick in 2009.

APRIL 17 Red Bull New York signs top Columbian striker Juan Pablo Angel from Aston Villa of the Premiership, using their second Designated Player slot on the Colombian star.

MAY 8 Juan Pablo Angel makes a strong debut for the RedBulls against the LA Galaxy in a 3-1 loss in the Red Bulls' U.S. Open Cup match. He notches his first goal in a Red Bullsuniform in the game on a free kick to erase the shutout.

MAY 31 In just his first month of action in a Red Bulls uniform Juan Pablo Angel receives the MLS Player of the Month award, showing fans that he will play an integral part in the Red Bulls' offensive attack.

JUNE 6 Led by Juan Pablo Angel's two goals, the Red Bulls defeat Toronto FC, in their first-ever matchup against the Canadian expansion team in front of a crowd of 20,113 at BMO Field in Toronto, Ontario.

JULY 20 Juan Pablo Angel receives the Honda Most Valuable Player Award in the MLS All-Star game at Dick's Sporting Goods Park, where the MLS All-Stars beat Celtic FC 2-0. Angel was also the leading vote getter for the All-Star Game.

AUGUST 8 Red Bull New York announces their plans to build a permanent training center in Hanover, NJ. The training grounds will include six soccer fields, a 50,000 square-foot two-story building and a one-story field house.

AUGUST 18 The Red Bulls host the Los Angeles Galaxy along with English-born International star David Beckham who signed with the Galaxy at the beginning of this year. An MLS regularseason record crowd of 66.237 shows up to Giants Stadium to see the Red Bulls knock off Beckham's Galaxy on a late Juan Pablo Angel goal. In the game. Clint Mathis breaks the Red Bulls club record for goals in a career in all competitions with his 45th goal.

SEPTEMBER 22 New York Red Bulls striker Juan Pablo Angel pulls into a tie with Adolfo Valencia for the club record for most goals scored in a season, set in 2000, courtesy of his game-tying goal in the 84th minute in the team's game against the New England Revolution.

SEPTEMBER 29 Juan Pablo Angel breaks the Red Bulls Single-season scoring record by scoring his 17th goal of the season for the Red Bulls in a 2-2 draw against Real Salt Lake. He breaks the record of 16 previously held by Adolfo Valencia, which was set in 2000.

OCTOBER 8 With 39 points, the Red Bulls clinch a playoff berth for the fifth consecutive season by virtue of the Columbus Crew's 3-1 loss to FC Dallas. This marks the first time since the 2004 season that the Red Bulls know they are in the playoffs before the final day of the regular season.

NOVEMBER 3 The Red Bulls lose, 1-0 on aggregate, to the New England Revolution. falling out of the playoffs. After a scoreless first leg, the Red Bulls went into Gillette Stadium needing a win, but injuries to Claudio Reyna (hamstring) and Juan Pablo Angel (concussion) affect the side and Taylor Twellman slots home a second half winner to put New England through.

NOVEMBER 5 Red Bull New York Sporting Director and head coach Bruce Arena resigns. A worldwide search for a replacement for head coach starts immediately.

NOVEMBER 9 Red Bulls forward Jozy Altidore, who just turns 18 three days before, is called up to the U.S. men's national team squad that faces South Africa in Johannesburg on November 17. It is his first senior team call-up, after scoring nine goals for the Red Bulls in 2007.

NOVEMBER 16 Red Bull New York announces that it has purchased AEG's 50% interest in the development of Red Bull Park. Going forward, Red Bull New York will have full ownership of the project and oversee all aspects of construction and stadium management.

NOVEMBER 17 Juan Pablo Angel is named to the MLS Best XI.

NOVEMBER 21 New York trades Clint Mathis to Los Angeles for a third-round selection in the 2008 MLS SuperDraft.

DECEMBER 18 The Red Bulls introduce Juan Carlos Osorio as their head coach at a press conference in lower Manhattan

JULY 16 Red Bull captain and Designated Player Claudio Revna, a former U.S. National Team captain, announces his retirement from professional soccer after 14 years, the final two with the Red Bulls. Revna. who is widely considered one of the best American players in U.S. soccer history, will continue with Red Bull New York in a role as an ambassador to work with the team to grow the sport in the metropolitan New York area.

AUGUST 19 Red Bull New York has announced that its state-of-the-art soccer-specific stadium being built in Harrison. New Jersey, has been renamed Red Bull Arena. Additionally, the next phase of construction erection of structural steel began with the first columns being connected to the foundation.

SEPTEMBER 12 Defender Hunter Freeman is traded to Toronto FC in exchange for a third and fourth-round pick in the 2009 MLS Supplemental Draft.

OCTOBER 19 In his first MLS appearance and start, goalkeeper Danny Cepero makes two saves. earns his first win and scores the first MLS goal by a goalkeeper when his 83rd-minute, 80+-yard free kick bounces over the head of Crew goalkeeper Andy Gruenebaum and into the back of the net.

NOVEMBER 9 Goals by Dane Richards. Juan Pablo Angel, and John Wolvniec propel New York to a 3-0 second-leg win and a 4-1 aggregate victory over two-time defending MLS Champion Houston Dynamo in the Western Conference Semifinals at Robertson Stadium in Houston, TX. The series win marks just the second time in the franchise's 13-year history that they have gotten through the first round of the MLS Cup Playoffs. The win was New York's first playoff road victory since a 2-1 win in Dallas on September 20, 2000.

NOVEMBER 15 A 28th-minute goal from Dave van den Bergh and seven saves from Danny Cepero lift New York to a 1-0 win at Real Salt Lake, giving the Red Bulls the Western Conference Championship, and the franchise's first-ever Conference Championship and MLS Cup Finals berth.

NOVEMBER 23 The Red Bulls drop a 3-1 decision to the Columbus Crew at The Home Depot Center in the first-ever MLS Cup Finals appearance for New York. John Wolyniec scores the first MLS Cup Finals goal in franchise history in the 51st minute.

NOVEMBER 26 New York loses defender Jeff Parke, second all-time in games played and games started in club history, to the MLS Expansion Draft, and selects former New York defender Mike Petke, who ranks first in both categories, from the Colorado Rapids in the MLS Waiver Draft.

MAY 11 Macoumba Kandji earns MLS Player of the Week after being part of all four goals scored in the team's 4-1 win over the San Jose Earthquakes.

MAY 16 The Red Bulls team played on the flight deck of the USS Intrepid during Fleet Week in NYC. The team competes in 6 v 6 matches against Sailors, Marines, and Coast Guardsmen from U.S. Navy and U.S. Coast Guard.

JUNE 29 The Red Bulls signs goalkeeper Bouna Coundou lafter acquiring his MLS rights from the Colorado Rapids.

JULY 30 Playing in their first-ever CONCACAF Champions League match against Trinidad and Tobago side, W Connection, the Red Bulls draw 2-2 in the first leg at Manny Ramjohn Stadium in Marabella, Trinidad and Tobago. New York goes on to lose the second leg, 2-1, at Giants Stadium on August 5.

AUGUST 21 Red Bulls head coach Juan Carlos Osorio resigns. The Red Bulls also announce assistant coach Richie Williams will serve as the interim coach for the remainder of the 2009 season.

OCTOBER 14 The installation of the Kentucky Bluegrass field begins at Red Bull Arena in Harrison. N.J.

OCTOBER 23 Midfielder Albert Celades announces his retirement from professional soccer.

OCTOBER 24 The Red Bulls play their last match at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, NJ. In a fitting ending to a long history at Giants Stadium, the Red Bulls defeated Toronto FC. 5-0.

The players chosen are goalkeeper Tim Howard, defenders Jeff Parke, Mike Petke, Eddie Pope, midfielders Youri Djorkaeff, Amado Guevara, Tab Ramos, Dave van den Bergh, and forwards Jozy Altidore, Juan Pablo Angel, Clint Mathis.

MARCH 20 New York opens Red Bull Arena with a 3-1 defeat of Brazil's Santos FC. The Grand Opening is seen by a capacity crowd of 25,000.

MARCH 26 The Red Bulls sign Juan Agudelo, the second Home Grown player produced by the club to join the first team.

MARCH 27 The Red Bulls dispatch the Chicago Fire 1-0 in theMLS season opener at Red Bull Arena, the first league match in the new stadium

MARCH 30 Assistant coach Richie Williams signs a contract extension with the New York Red Bulls after five years as an assistant coach in the organization.

APRIL 9 New York signs forward Salou Ibrahim, who last played for Danish side Vejle Boldklub.

APRIL 3 The Red Bulls defeat Seattle Sounders FC, 1-0, at Qwest Field, snapping a 26-match regular-season road winless streak. The team's last regular-season road victory came on May 10, 2008, a 2-1 victory over the LA Galaxy at the Home Depot Center.

APRIL 27 Juan Agudelo becomes the first Red Bulls Academy product to feature for the first team, when he starts in the team's 2-1 U.S. Open Cup Victory over the Philadelphia Union at Red Bull Arena.

MAY 20 Defender Mike Petke appears in his 300th Major League Soccer match, becoming just the 11th outfield player in league history to do so.

MAY 23 Red Bull Arena hosts its first international friendly featuring a European club as the Red Bulls defeat Italian giants Juventus FC by a 3-1 score in front of 18,735 spectators.

JUNE 16 Brazilian club Cruzeiro downs the Red Bulls 4-2 in an international friendly at Red Bull Arena.

JULY 14 The Red Bulls announce the signing of Designated Player and former Barcelona, Arsenal, Juventus and Monaco striker Thierry Henry. The former World Cup, European Championship and Champions League winner joined as the club's third-ever Designated Player.

JULY 22 The first-ever Barclays New York Challenge kicks off with the Red Bulls hosting Premier League club Tottenham Hotspur FC. The game marks Thierry Henry's Red Bulls debut, and while the Frenchman opened the scoring, Spurs got two second half goals to take the game, 2-1.

JULY 23 The Barclays New York Challenge continues as Portuguese club Sporting Clube de Portgual upend England's Manchester City FC by a 2-0 score.

JULY 25 The Barclays New York Challenge concludes with a doubleheader at Red Bull Arena. In the first match, Tottenham and Sporting battle to a 2-2 draw, and in the final match of the showcase, the Red Bulls knock off Manchester City, 2-1. In total, over 50,000 fans pack Red Bull Arena during the three-day tournament, which is won by Sporting.

JULY 30 Club waives John Wolyniec.

JULY 31 Thierry Henry makes his Red Bulls regular-season debut, and assists on both Red Bullsgoals as the club draws, 2-2, at Houston.

AUGUST 2 New York announces the signing of its fourth-ever Designated Player, Mexican captain Rafa Marquez. Marquez joined the Red Bulls after a successful stint with Barcelona, where he became the first-ever Mexican-born player to win the UEFA Champions League.

AUGUST 8 Marquez makes his Red Bulls debut, in a historic match for Major League Soccer, as a record five Designated Players play in the match, as the Fire's Freddie Ljungberg and Nery Castillo join Henry, Marquez and Juan Pablo Angel on the pitch.

The Red Bulls and Fire play to a 0-0 draw.

AUGUST 14 Red Bull Arena sees its first sell-out for a Major League Soccer match when the RedBulls host to Los Angeles Galaxy. The Galaxy down New York. 1-0.

AUGUST 21 Marquez scores his first goal for the club in a 4-1 victory at Toronto FC. Marquez's wonder strike is named the MLS Goal of the Week.

AUGUST 28 Thierry Henry notches his first MLS goal as he provides the insurance goal in a 2-0 home victory over the San Jose Earthquakes.

SEPTEMBER 1 Defender Mike Petke announces his retirement from professional soccer effective at the end of the season. Petke finishes his career as the franchise leader in games played, games started, and minutes played.

SEPTEMBER 9 Forward John Wolyniec announces his retirement from professional soccer, ranking fifth on the club's all-time goal scoring list, and second on the team's games played list.

SEPTEMBER 14 Red Bulls acquire midfielder Mehdi Ballouchy from the Colorado Rapids in exchange for forward Macoumba Kandji. Additionally, midfielder Seth Stammler announces his retirement from professional soccer effective at the end of the season. Stammler finishes his career third on the team's all-time games played and starts list.

SEPTEMBER 15 Red Bulls acquire defender Carey Talley from D.C. United in exchange for a conditional second-round draft selection in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft.

OCTOBER 2 With a 1-0 victory over the Kansas City Wizards at Red Bull Arena, the Red Bulls clinch a playoff spot in the 2010 MLS Cup Playoffs. The shutout was goalkeeper Bouna Coundoul's 10th of the season, breaking Tony Meola's previous franchise record for a single season. Coundoul finished the season with 11 shutouts

OCTOBER 21 The Red Bulls clinch home field advantage throughout the playoffs with a 2-0 victory over the New England Revolution in the final regular season match of the year. It marks only the second time in club history that the team finished the regular season with the best record in the Eastern Conference.

NOVEMBER 4 The 2010 season comes to a close as the Red Bulls are eliminated from the MLS Cup Playoffs by the San Jose Earthquakes in the Eastern Conference Semifinals. After winning the first leg in San Jose by a 1-0 score, the Red Bulls dropped the home leg, 3-1, to fall in the series 3-2 on aggregate.

NOVEMBER 8 Red Bull Seth Stammler is named MLS W.O.R.K.S Humanitarian of the Year for philanthropic work following the devastating earthquake in Haiti.

NOVEMBER 11 Red Bull rookies Tim Ream and Juan Agudelo receive calls to join the US Men's National Team in a friendly against South Africa on November 17 in Cape Town. This was the first call-up to the USMNT for both Ream and Agudelo.

NOVEMBER 15 Juan Agudelo become the youngest player to score for the US national team in the team's 1-0 victory over South Africa. This was also the US Men's National team debut for Agudelo and teammate Tim Ream.



On January 21, 2015, the New York Red Bulls announced that the club successfully acquired the rights to a United Soccer League (USL) franchise. An essential stepping stone in the development of the modern American soccer player, the inception of a USL team for the Red Bulls has allowed for academy players, USL players, draft picks and other MLS loaned players to play meaningful, competitive and professional games in working to earn a spot on the First Team.

Less than a month later, New York Red Bulls II was born. The Red Bulls unveiled NYRB II's name and logo on Feb. 9, 2015, and made Tyler Adams the club's first ever signing in March. The 16-year-old Red Bulls Academy product was first introduced to the organization through the Red Bulls Regional Development School (RDS) at the age of 10 and is the first player to graduate the RDS and progress all the way through the Red Bulls academy system to a professional contract. Following the conclusion of the 2015 USL season, he became a member of the First Team.

Following open tryouts and preseason, Red Bulls II announced its first roster ahead of its inaugural USL match which consisted of 11 USL players, four MLS loans, and five Red Bulls academy players who each signed a USL agreement for academy players, allowing them to play for NYRB II while preserving their amateur status. In total, 12 of the 20 players listed on the roster for the first game were Red Bulls academy products.

The team played its first match on March 28 at Red Bull Arena against Rochester Rhinos. The young Red Bulls II team played to a scoreless draw, 0-0. In the next game, New York welcomed Toronto FC II. MLS loan Anatole Abang scored the first goal in club history, thanks to an assist from Sean Davis, and Red Bulls II earned its first ever victory, 4-1.

The club's most memorable victory came on July 22, when the New York Red Bulls hosted and defeated the defending English Premier League champion Chelsea FC in the 2015 International Champions Cup, 4-2. Red Bulls head coach Jesse Marsch provided 15 players, all regular Red Bulls II starters, their First Team debuts against Chelsea.

After going into halftime trailing the English champions, 1-0, Red Bulls Academy product Franklin Castellanos leveled the score in the 51st minute. Shortly afterwards, Tyler Adams scored his first professional goal to put New York ahead in the 69th minute. Four minutes later, Sean Davis added a third. Although Chelsea pulled one back, the Red Bulls proved it was their night and Davis answered with the fourth and final goal in the 77th minute to earn New York a victory that made global headlines.

Red Bulls II never looked back since, finishing the season strong and earning the club's first ever USL Playoffs berth. The club finished its inaugural regular season 12-10-6, in fourth place of the Eastern Conference. NYRB II were also the fourth-highest scoring team in the league.

On Sept. 26, NYRB II hosted and won its first postseason match at Red Bull Arena against Pittsburgh Riverhounds in overtime of the Eastern Conference Quarterfinals, 4-2. In the first overtime session, the Riverhounds took a 2-1 lead with a goal in the 96th minute, but captain Karl Ouimette leveled the match in the 102nd minute to keep New York's playoff hopes alive. In the second overtime, Ouimette snatched another goal in the 115th minute, the game-winner, and Daniel Bedoya buried NYRB II's fourth goal to finish the game.

Red Bulls II's playoff run ended in the Eastern Conference Semifinals against Rochester Rhinos, the eventual 2015 USL champions, in an impressive first season for the young team.

"It's been kind of one of the shining stars of the year in terms of USL and that player development platform," Sporting Director Ali Curtis said. "That's been unbelievable for us, it really has helped guys like Tyler Adams and Sean Davis and [Anatole] Abang like you mentioned, it's helped even the young player in Derrick Etienne and the season that he had at [University of Virginia] and you know developing through our pyramid so it's been fantastic for those guys."

"They get meaningful training opportunities as well as meaningful minutes against real professionals in games that count and it's expedited their development so if you looked at the first half of the season and where guys were playing from the USL perspective and Sean Davis and Abang and those guys, it's helped their

development as soccer players and contributing to our team at the MLS level."

In 2016, five USL players - Stefano Bonomo, Dan Metzger, Devon Williams, Konrad Plewa and Rafael Diaz - will be returning to the squad as head coach John Wolyniec and his technical staff looks to build upon a successful first season in USI

"We'll get better at that platform, we'll get more sophisticated, that team will get stronger, we'll look to add more local players to that team so it's very exciting," Curtis said. "I think the future is bright particularly because as an organization we're able to make that investment, which is fantastic by the way, so it's exciting."

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Accredited photographers and Electronic News Gathering (ENG) crews may shoot from the designated areas on the field. Please contact the Communications Department with any questions.

ENG PRODUCTION

Only National Broadcast Partners or local broadcast partners are permitted to a) film any match in its entirety and/or b) broadcast a live transmission of any game. Any other ENG outlets may film limited MLS match video highlights (i.e. B-roll) during only the first 15 minutes of each half. ENG crews will not be permitted to film overtime, but may film post-game celebrations. ENG crew are required to position themselves during games in a designated area determined by the Red Bulls Communications Department.
